

Stampbord Featured How-to

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Stampbord 8x8 Block "A Starlit Dream"

Step 1: Use masking tape to protect the surface of the Stampbord and then paint the sides of the 8x8 block with blue Lumiere metallic paint. While the paint is wet, add flourishes of purple metallic paint.

Step 2: Keep the masking tape on and use a damp sea sponge to add a speckled effect with silver metallic paint. Let the paint dry completely and then remove the masking tape.

Step 3: Use StazOn black ink to stamp the woman in the upper right corner. Heat set to ensure a smudge-proof image.

Step 4: Using a makeup sponge, apply color starting with the light inks first. The star, moon and sun areas are yellow and the face is pink. When the two colors meet, they make a nice orange for the hair.



Step 5: Keep adding color to the Stampbord, getting darker as you go. Reapply color as needed and always use a circular motion with the sponge. Use the darkest colors around the edges. With a paintbrush, add color to her lips and eyelids.





Step 6: Stamp the 1x1 squares by placing the inked stamp upside down and placing the Stampbord on top of the specific design wanted and press firmly. Carefully lift straight up. Color with the same colors as on the Stampbord Block and then set aside.


Step 7: Use the Stampbord Tools to add detail to the project and small squares. Be careful not to take off too much color on the face. Add shine areas on her lips, cheeks, nose and forehead.

Step 8: Use Oil-Free Steel Wool and sandpaper where needed to create a circular motion around her for the stars. Add stars of all sizes with the Scratch Knife.

Step 9: Use the Krylon silver leaf pen to go around the top edges of the block and around the edges of the small squares. Make sure to let it dry completely before handling the project again.



Step 10: When dry, use “The Ultimate!” glue to adhere the 1x1 squares to the block on all four sides, point up like a diamond. Use Krylon Crystal Clear Spray to add a finish to the project. This will also bring out the colors.

Step 11: Glue the fiber to the inside bottom and stretch across the left side (like a fan) to the top inside and glue down. Add a puzzle piece to the bottom, gathering the fibers to fit inside puzzle notches on its top and bottom.



Step 12

Step 12: Glue the Baubles in a circular pattern inside the star track. Finally, glue a crystal rhinestone to the woman’s “forehead star”.
